

CYB All-Star Nomination & Selection Procedures

(Revised June 11, 2008)

In an effort to promote equity, fairness and objectivity Claremont Youth Basketball (CYB) Board of Directors has established the following policy and procedures in selecting players to participate in the annual CYB's All-Star games. Selection of players should consist of not only basketball skills that include offensive and defensive skills but also a player selected should have demonstrated commitment to the team, sportsmanship, positive impact on the team and team peers, participation and attendance at practices and games, and leadership and contributions that foster an enjoyable experience for CYB's recreational basketball program.

Procedure in Selecting Players for All-Stars

1. The number of players nominated per team for each division will be determined by the CYB's executive board with cooperation of the respective Divisions Commissioners.
 - 1.1. For 2007-2008 the number of players nominated per team is...
 - 1.1.1. boys division 1 = up to 4 players per team
 - 1.1.2. boys division 2 = up to 4 players per team
 - 1.1.3. boys division 3 = up to 4 players per team
 - 1.1.4. girls division 1 = there is only 4 teams, all 32 players
 - 1.1.5. girls division 2 = all star shuffle
 - 1.1.6. girls division 3 = all star shuffle
2. Coaches will nominate up to the predetermined and approved number of candidates. These nominations are to be submitted in writing or emailed to the division commissioner by the Monday following the last game of the season.
 - 2.1. Nominations not received by this deadline will not be accepted.
3. The Commissioner will establish a meeting date prior to playoffs with the coaches and provide a list of the players nominated at the meeting and not before.
 - 3.1. The list of nominated players will **NOT** be circulated or provided to coaches until that meeting.
 - 3.2. The nomination and selection process for All Star players is a **CONFIDENTIAL** process. Coaches are encouraged not to discuss their nominations and voting with other team coaches or parents/family of players.
 - 3.3. Coaches have a responsibility to observe players on other teams throughout the season.
 - 3.4. If the coach cannot attend the meeting then the coach can designate an assistant coach to be the team's representative. Only one individual for each team can attend the meeting. The head coach must advise the commissioner if another individual will represent the team prior to the meeting.
 - 3.5. The commissioner is representing CYB and is not considered a team representative.
4. Coaches must vote for 20 of the nominees from the list prepared by the commissioner.
 - 4.1. There will be **NO discussion or "lobbying"** for votes by anyone in attendance at this meeting in this first round of voting.

- 4.2. Any player receiving a majority of the coaches' votes will be selected for the All-Star Team except in the case of item #4.3.
- 4.3. If more than 20 players receive a majority of the vote, the commissioner will confidentially rank the players and determine if 20 players have a higher majority.
- 4.4. If the commissioner cannot clearly identify 20 players then the players with the least majority will be placed on a second ballot for coaches to vote for the number of players needed to establish 20 All-Stars.
- 4.5. Players that receive no votes are eliminated from any further balloting.
- 4.6. The number of votes received by players will not be disclosed by the commissioner.
5. If less than 20 players receive a majority of the vote, those players receiving less than a majority of the coaches' votes will be listed on a second ballot; players that receive no votes are eliminated from any further balloting.
 - 5.1. If coaches need information on players that are on the second round balloting, the player's coach may use up to one minute per player for a brief presentation; but only for those players from his/her team.
 - 5.2. Coaches will vote for the number of players that will make a total of 20 All-Stars. Players receiving the most votes and at least a majority of the votes will be selected for the All-Star Team.
 - 5.3. If the total exceeds more than 20 players, those players receiving the most votes will be placed on a third ballot. The ballot process will continue until 20 All-Stars have been selected.
6. There will be two alternatives selected for All-Stars.
 - 6.1. The two players with the highest votes that did not make the All-Stars will be nominated as alternates in the event a player cannot participate in the All-Star game.
7. The coaches from the top two teams during the regular season will be asked to coach the all-star game. If one or both coaches decline the commissioner will ask coaches in subsequent placing.
 - 7.1. The coach's child is automatically place on their parent's team; the commissioner will consult with the coaches as to the child's ranking of 1 through 10
 - 7.2. All Star teams will be selected similar to the league draft rules; coaches cannot agree or freeze players for their team.
 - 7.3. All Star coaches have the responsibility to contact the players selected and arrange for practice prior to the all star game.
 - 7.4. Coaches of players selected have the responsibility to provide a "fresh" signed copy of the Player Release Form to the All Star coach prior to the first practice.
